Tight, dry, wintry skin needs a little TLC, starting with what you use in the shower. Switching to a body wash instead of a bar of soap can make a big difference, especially if you use one that's free from sodium laurel (or laureth) sulphate, synthetic fragrances, petrochemicals and alcohol. Ridding your life of these things doesn't mean you need

to skimp on sensorial pleasures, however. Behold this fragrant bunch of body washes and their botanical-based goodness.

on the up

What do you get when you cross a rock 'n' roll quiff with a girlish high bun? Something akin to the tousled up-do worn by our model for this week's cover shoot. Created by hairstylist Shannon Lee Johnson from D&M Hair Design, it's an elegant yet edgy style that's great for evening, or when you need to add drama to a simple outfit. Here's how to get the look at home.



1. Begin by blow-drying a protective serum into your hair in preparation for using heated styling tools. Look for one that both smoothes and protects, such as Schwarzkopf Osis Flatliner, \$31, which comes in a handy spray bottle.
2. Use heat stylers to create rough waves –

Johnson used ghd IV stylers, \$350, which have a curved barrel. Twist sections of your hair around the barrel at a 45-degree angle, pulling outwards to create curls.

3. Brush your hair towards the top of your head and secure with a hair tie. Spritz any flyaways with hairspray – choose one that's not too sticky but still has good hold.

4. Loosen the curls with your fingertips so they don't look too prim. Add volume with a product such as Schwarzkopf Osis Dust It, \$31, a mattifying powder that also provides hold.
5. Mould the curls into shape, using fine-wired fringe pins to keep them in place. These are much better than bobby pins for up-dos as they're invisible. There's no need to be fussy with pin placement – it's not supposed to look perfect.
